

Are You a Consumer or a Worshipper?

John 2:13-22

1. Prescribed Worship.

- The reason the law was so exacting about the care of the Passover lamb was so that their worship of God wasn't just a once-a-year thing.
- The first part was bringing a worthy animal from your own flock or herd.

- a. To experience *cooperate* worship.
- The reason the temple was there was to serve as a visual representation of the *Glory* of *God*.
- b. To pay the *temple tax*.
- c. Passover is the *midpoint* of the Jewish Year.
- Passover served as a midway point to keep people Spiritually <u>on track</u> during the year.

- 2. The *problem* that drove Jesus into a rage.
- All of this was approved and even managed by the temple leadership.
- So some local businessmen, seeing an opportunity, decided to open a few stalls of <u>acceptable</u> animals for sale.

ALL OF THIS WAS DONE WITH THE PERMISSION AND SUPERVISION OF THE PRIESTHOOD.

- All of this started because the people didn't want the inconvenience of proper worship.
- A consumer mentality says I want it <u>my way</u>.
- No one really considers that perhaps the priests were under pressure from the people to change things to make it <u>easier</u> on them.

- So the temptation to <u>compromise</u> a little is huge in today's church-
- What happens is slowly those people go from worshipping God, to being consumers of a religion.
- But then we will have to face a whipping, swinging Jesus, and me in particular.

- It's <u>where</u> it happened that angered Jesus the most- in the Court of the Gentiles.
- So the <u>first</u> <u>thing</u> a person seeking God saw upon entering the temple was people being fleeced for money in the name of their faith.

"What can I get out of this with the least amount of effort or cost to me?"

"How can I use what God has given me in time, talent or treasure to see His Kingdom Come in my family, my neighbors, my workplace or my community?"
