Real Love I Thessalonians 4:1—12

- **1.** One myth our culture feeds us is that REAL LOVE IS **SEX**.
- •A God-pleasing life is a life of sanctification.
- •The emphasis of this particular word is on the *transforming* process.

- To avoid means is to stay <u>away</u> from something, to keep our distance, like not walking on the frozen lake because of the "Thin Ice" sign.
- The word Paul uses for "sexual immorality" here is the Greek word *porneia*.
- **Separating** ourselves is the negative side of our sexual sanctification.
- The positive side is learning how to control our bodies.

- We demonstrate real love by <u>respecting</u> God's sexual boundaries.
- One reason is that sexual sin <u>reflects</u> secular values (4:5).
- Another reason is because sexual sin *devalues* people (4:6a).
- The word for "wrong" here means to "step over the prescribed boundaries."

- The word for "take advantage" means "to <u>exploit</u> or use" a person.
- In the end sexual sin reduces people to objects to be <u>used</u> rather than people to be <u>valued</u>.
- Sexual sin also provokes God's *justice* (4:6b).
- Finally, sexual sin <u>rejects</u> God's calling (4:7-8).

- 2. The second myth about love in our culture is that REAL LOVE is *INDEPENDANCE*. (4:9-10).
- •That's exactly where many people are today, left without a place to <u>belong</u>, without any sort of connectedness.
- •We demonstrate real love by treating each other as *FAMILY*.

- 3. Now the final myth I want to talk about is the opposite of independence, and that's that REAL LOVE IS <u>DEPENDENCE</u> (4:11-12).
- •Unhealthy dependence isn't love, but it's <u>manipulation</u> that takes advantage of others.
- •WE DEMONSTRATE REAL LOVE BY STRIVING TO LIVE A *RESPONSIBLE* LIFE.

 By living responsible lives they'll communicate the message of Christ to the watching world.
