The Wise and the Otherwise James 3:13–18

- 1. James' Challenge: Who Is Wise?
- In the New Testament it means applying spiritual <u>truth</u> in one's life.
- James is asking who is truly skilled in the art of living.

- James answers his question of challenge with an imperative, SHOW IT!
- Meekness is a picture of <u>strength</u> under <u>control</u>.

- 2. The Otherwise: <u>False</u> Wisdom (It's Roots, Attributes and Fruit) a. He first speaks to Bitter <u>Jealousy</u>.
- It is <u>selfishly</u> motivated, harsh, and critical of others.

- b. Selfish *Ambition*.
- False wisdom is not a <u>brain</u> problem but a <u>heart</u> problem!

## The Roots: Five Attributes of False Wisdom:

- Arrogance
- Self-deception
- Earthly
- Unspiritual
- Demonic

## The Fruit of False Wisdom

- <u>Disorder</u>
- Every vile practice

- 3. The Wise: *True* Wisdom
- James simply says this wisdom has its ROOTS from *above*.
- To 'raise a harvest of righteousness' demands a certain kind of *climate*.
