

#### A NATION OF PRIESTS

1 Peter 2:9-10; Isaiah 9:6-7

God's will is done God's way, among God's people.

 So we will discover today how the Old Testament was <u>preparing</u> God's people long ago to receive the King of Kings.

1. God's people moved from <u>slavery</u> to <u>freedom</u>.

 We find the Kingdom of God presented subtly at first and later in a <u>bold</u> and outright way.

- In the blink of an eye, the greatest <u>military power</u> on earth was defeated.
- The people of Israel thought they were going to die, only to see God <u>rescue</u> them in dramatic and miraculous fashion.

- The Song of Moses talks about how the story of Israel's freedom will instill fear in all of their enemies.
- That one word, <u>reign</u>, is the beginning the Kingdom of God theology in the Old Testament.

- God himself declares His purposethat the nation of Israel would become a <u>kingdom</u> of priests and a <u>holy</u> nation.
- The <u>nations</u> of the world would behold Israel's beauty and holiness.

 He wanted an entire kingdom that consisted of priests <u>dedicated</u> solely to Him.

 Martin Luther called it "the priesthood of all believers."

 We have <u>received</u> mercy in order that we would <u>show</u> the mercy and goodness of God to a watching world.

- David was a <u>representation</u> of the eventual Messiah, who was yet to come.
- While King David was himself not perfect, he was a <u>type</u> of Messiah.
- In that day, all of Israel <u>expected</u> that the Messiah would be the "Son of David."

- The greatness of David's kingdom led the people of Israel to look for a day when <u>God himself</u> would be king among them.
- We are called to order our lives around the <u>values</u> and the <u>priorities</u> of the King.

- 3. The prophet Isaiah spoke of what the world would be like when the Son of God took His place as the King of God's <u>eternal kingdom</u>.
- Isaiah not only prophesied about the <u>coming</u> of the Messiah, he also prophesied about the <u>rule</u> and <u>reign</u> of the Messiah.

- There are so many passages in Isaiah that declare the coming kingdom and the greatness of the King.
- And Isaiah prophesies that the government of God and the peace of Christ will be without end!

- And the book of Isaiah is <u>filled</u> with prophecies about the King and His Kingdom.
- God had been teaching Israel about the coming of the King and His forever Kingdom throughout the entire book!

 They discovered the Lord's <u>fingerprints</u> all over the Old Testament!

 We are the priests who deliver the good news to all the world.
