

- Zechariah wanted the <u>Altar</u>, but he also got the <u>Angel</u>.
- So along with the Altar, and the Angel, Zechariah got the *Annunciation*.
- It's a fancy word for an <u>announcement</u>.
- They could not <u>take</u> credit, but only <u>give</u> credit to God for His great gift.

- 1. God has plans for the world.
- He has <u>woven</u> His plans into the fabric of future history.



- 2. Every person has a purpose.
- John's purpose was to make people <u>ready</u> for the Lord.



- 3. God prepares *parents* to fulfill His purposes.
- John was announced and born, at just the right time for him, for his parents to raise him to be the <u>most</u> <u>important</u> prophet in Biblical history.

FORERUNE

- 4. God makes promises.
- The angel's announcement to Zechariah uses the very same words,
   400 years later.



- 5. God keeps promises.
- This book [the Bible] is <u>filled</u> with <u>promises</u> from God, to you and me.



- 6. God answers prayers.
- And God will either <u>answer</u> them or <u>exceed</u> them.
- Jesus called this kind of life,
   "abundant life."
- What we can learn from Zechariah is that any day can become your <u>best</u> day.
