

- He gave us <u>baptism</u> as an outward sign of our repentance and allegiance to Jesus (Lk. 3:3).
- He told us that Jesus was <u>coming</u> (Mk. 1:7).
- He gave Jesus His first <u>sermon</u> (Mt. 3:2;
 4:17).

FORERUNE

- He <u>introduced</u> Jesus to the world, and to His first disciples (Jn. 1:29; 1:36).
- He was the first <u>martyr</u> of the Christian era (Mt. 14:10).
- Matthew and Luke tell us the story of Jesus' birth from <u>earth's</u> perspective.

FORFRUMER

- John gives us the story from <u>heaven's</u> perspective.
- John's purpose for coming was so that <u>all</u> <u>might believe</u> through him.



- 1. Whet their appetite (Jn. 1:26-27).
- John whets their appetites, so that people *want* to know about Jesus.



- 2. Tell them about Him (Jn. 1:29b).
- First, he calls Jesus "The <u>Lamb</u> of <u>God</u>."
- John taps into their <u>longing</u> to have the living, final Lamb come into their house.
- He taps into their longing to have sin removed once-for-all.

FORERUNE

- 3. Describe what He can do for them (Jn.1:32).
- What sets Jesus apart is that the Holy Spirit didn't <u>depart</u> from Him.



- 4. Tell them about *your experience* with Him (Jn. 1:33).
- · People don't argue with your experience.
- Being baptized with the Holy Spirit means having the Spirit of God come and <u>live</u> <u>inside</u> of you.
- This is a conversation that happens over
 4 consecutive days.

 FORERUM

- 5. Encourage them to become a *follower* (Jn. 1:36-37).
- Whet their appetite (Jn. 1:26-27).
 Tell them about Him (Jn. 1:29b).
 Describe what He can do for them (Jn.1:32).
 Tell them about your experience with Him (Jn. 1:33).

- · Each one reach one.
- If you'll *introduce* people to Jesus, and He'll take it from there.
