



 Read the Bible from cover to cover, and you'll find that it pictures God in <u>search</u> <u>mode</u>.

- 1. The first category of people that God is searching for are what He calls, the <u>fully committed</u>.
- The first kind is the kind He <u>can</u>
 <u>use</u>.

- Luke 15 explains why God is searching for fully committed people.
- He asks them a question about doing something they would <u>never</u> <u>do</u>.

- He leaves them in potential <u>danger</u> to go and find the one that's lost.
- Some scholars think this woman's coins represent her dowry, her <u>bride-price</u>.

- a. The plot line involves something lost.
- b. What is lost really <u>matters</u> to the hero of the story.

- c. When what was lost is found, the hero is so happy, they <u>throw</u> a <u>party</u> to express their joy.
- d. The hero is someone who wouldn't really be <u>admired</u> by most religious leaders.

 You have Jesus standing in front of a group of long-standing religious types, who think they have figured out what really matters to God.

- They see <u>themselves</u> as the fully committed.
- Then He tells them about lost things that matter to people they don't admire.

- 2. The Second type of people that God longs for and searches for are those who are *lost*.
- And the fully committed are not proud, self-conscious, religious types who think that the most important thing is their <u>religious</u> <u>life</u>.

- a. Lost people <u>matter</u> to God so much, that He's on an all-out search to find them.
- b. The fully committed are those who understand this and rejoice with God when He finds what is lost, so much so that they *join* the all-out search as well.

- He is enlisting all of His other children who are <u>willing</u> to join the search.
- The problem was that I thought serving Him fully, meant serving His already-saved sheep.

• The <u>casual</u> Christian and the <u>committed</u> Christian.
