## GOD'S EYES

 MEASURING YOUR WORTH IN GOD'S EYES
 Prodigal means "<u>recklessly wasteful</u>, <u>extravagant</u>."

- I think the story is actually about the *father*.
- It's about a father who is extravagant and recklessly wasteful with his <u>love</u> for his children.

MEASURING YOUR WORTH IN GOD'S EYES 1. The younger son asks the father to <u>divide</u> his <u>property</u> between his sons.

- What Jesus was actually describing here, would be <u>scandalous</u> to every person who heard it.
- He had to *liquidate* his inheritance.

MEASURING YOUR WORTH IN GOD'S EYES 2. In the faraway country, this wayward son gradually descends into his own *personal* hell.

- So when the son asks for a job, one of the citizens offers to let him become his <u>pig herder</u>.
- In this hole of self-pity, he begins to think <u>honestly</u> about himself.

MEASURING YOUR WORTH IN GOD'S EYES

- 3. The younger son *returns*.
- He knows that the son, given the maturity level and the character with which he left home, is *bound* to *fail*.
- The second thing the father knows is that the <u>village</u> will not treat him well.

MEASURING YOUR WORTH IN GOD'S EYES a.The first thing the father does is, <u>he</u> runs.

- b. The second thing the father does is, he **kisses** his son.
- c. The third thing the father does is call for a *robe* to be put on his son.
- d. The fourth thing the father does is call for a *ring*.

MEASURING YOUR WORTH IN GOD'S EYES e. Finally, the father says, "Bring the <u>fatted calf</u> and kill it" (Luke 15:23).

- He's inviting the <u>whole village</u> to share his joy.
- Only the riches aren't about money, they're about measuring <u>your worth</u> in God's eyes.

4. Scene four is about the <u>older son</u>.
With him not at the party, everybody knows that he has <u>rejected</u> his father.

 He hasn't lived with him like a <u>son</u>, but like a <u>servant</u>. MEASURING YOUR WORTH IN GOD'S EYES

 The truly sad and amazing thing about the son, though, is that he felt
 <u>deprived</u> by the father.

• He *humiliates* himself by leaving the party and going out to his older son.

MEASURING YOUR WORTH IN GOD'S EYES

- Clearly in their <u>minds</u>, they were the older sons.
- The point of this story is that the father loves all his children so much that he is willing to suffer and be humiliated in order to <u>bring us home</u>.
